On Saturday, October 27, 2018 a workshop ," AAUW: Advantages and Opportunities for Student Activism, Self Actualization, and Building Communities" was offered as part of the 2018 Bridging the Student Gap Conference sponsored by the Diversity Committee of the Lehigh Valley Association of Independent Colleges, (LVAIC). The workshop provided an overview of the AAUW organization, its mission, programs and values and focused on opportunities for advocacy offered by AAUW Student organizations and on modeling of activism on campus by student leaders from AAUW Moravian and AAUW-Lehigh. Accompanied by PowerPoint slides, speakers addressed specific topics including: AAUW Issues such as Voting Rights, Student Debt, Title IX, Reproductive Rights; Finding Your Voice; Becoming a Campus Change Agent; Networking; Campus Action Project Grants; and Developing Leadership Skills.

Attendees also learned about many AAUW perks including free student memberships for College/University Partner colleges/ universities; cross-generational opportunities and branch support including scholarships to attend NCCWSL (National College Conference for Women Student Leaders). As they left the program, each received a swag bag full of goodies including copies of *Barriers and Bias, The Simple Truth*, and *Deeper in Debt* along with AAUW Postcards and Vote Tattoos.


