Scholarships 2024 - Top of Their Class

Amazing women and cake: a combination enjoyed at this year's AAUW-Bethlehem Scholarship Dessert Reception. Over sixty-five guests and eighteen Branch members attended the May 15th event at the Advent Moravian Church in Hanover Township.



Book Fair Co-Chair Debbie Spinney began the evening's celebration with the announcement of the successful results of the 2024 Used Book Fair. Afterwards, Linda Robbins, Kathy Kahler, and Brenda Tomlinson, members of this year's AAUW-Bethlehem Awards Committee, presented *The Gateway to Equity Award* to our own Branch member, Dr. Rita M. Jones, Director of the Center for Gender Equity at Lehigh University. Dr. Jones

spoke to the audience about the importance of finding "your people" to support you and keep you honest to yourself as you go through life.

After hearing from Jasmine Vasquez, a former AAUW Bethlehem Scholarship recipient, and mother of one of this year's recipients, certificates were presented to two adult women returning to college after having their education interrupted, and twenty-nine high school senior girls. This year the Scholarship Committee solicited applications from William Allen High School and Louis E. Dieruff High School in Allentown, in addition to Liberty and Freedom High Schools in Bethlehem. These scholarships, based on academic performance and financial need, were funded by the previous years' Used Book Fairs. Over \$70,000 was awarded to this year's group of extraordinary women.

Gateway to Equity Award 2024

This year's award was presented to Dr. Rita M. Jones, a member of our own AAUW Bethlehem Branch, for her dedication and commitment to achieving gender equity and higher education for women and girls. She has been Director of the Center for Gender Equity and an affiliate faculty member in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies at Lehigh University since 2008.

She graduated with a PhD. in English Language and Literature from Washington State University, moved to Greeley, Colorado and directed the Women's Studies Program at the University of Northern Colorado. She expanded the program and number of

student and faculty participants, and developed sustainable connections with Student Affairs, the Women's Resource Center, and Campus Safety.

During her time at Lehigh, Dr. Jones has secured funding for an Associate Director Position and an annual graduate assistant position and quadrupled the size of the student staff. Currently she is developing the first ever Gender Equity Fellows Program. She served as AAUW College University Representative until 2022, when the partnership ended, and as liaison to the former AAUW Student Affiliate at Lehigh. She has received numerous awards for her service to Lehigh and the community.

You might find her volunteering at the AAUW Book Fair, spending time at her son's athletic events, or enjoying a day off with spouse and family. We are proud to present this award to one of our own and we couldn't be prouder of her current and future endeavors.

Madison Scarfaro Chosen As Law Student of the Year



Our own Madison Scarfaro was chosen by The National Jurist publication as one of eight Law Students of the Year. Each law school was asked to nominate one student deserving of recognition.

Madison dedicated much of her time to helping others, including advancing women's rights, and established herself as a leader on campus. She was a founding member of Lehigh Valley Anti-Trafficing Awareness Week and is planning a Long Island Human Trafficking Awareness Week near her New York law school.

She volunteers with the nonprofit New Hour, making time to go to Nassau Correctional Facility to meet with women in a drug and

alcohol treatment program. She also leads classes in Know Your Rights on a variety of topics at the facility.

Madison, the first student liaison to the Suffolk County Women in Courts Committee, is currently president of Touro's Women's Bar Association. Since her first year of law school, she has participated in Breaking Barriers, a student-run project of Touro's Public Advocacy Center. This project helps remove barriers to employment by helping people correct their Records of Arrest and Prosecutions (RAP) sheets.

Madison was named a Pro Bono Scholar for 2024, and this spring, she will work with the Federal Defenders.
